




In January, Guest Lecture was organized for students of class IX and XI on the topic "Temple Architecture in India – Development and Origin'.


Objectives: The objectives of the activity are to promote healthy eating habits among students. To educate students on the benefits of nutritious snacking. To provide students with healthy snack options.

CAREER GUIDANCE (ROBOTICS)

SEMINAR BY YOGESH VIJAYKUMAR (13-1-25)

As part of our initiative to provide career-oriented insights, the club hosted a seminar featuring Yogesh Vijaykumar, an alumnus of our school (Batch 2020-2021), who is currently working as a Robotics Software Engineer in Japan. The session focused on career opportunities in robotics, offering students a deeper understanding of the skills and knowledge required to excel in this field. Key takeaways from the seminar included:

- **Personal Journey in Robotics:** Yogesh shared his experiences in pursuing a career in robotics, detailing the challenges and milestones he encountered.
- **Introduction to ROS (Robot Operating System):** He emphasized the importance of learning ROS, a widely used framework in robotics development, and demonstrated its applications in the industry.
- **Professional Networking:** The significance of building professional connections through platforms like LinkedIn was highlighted, encouraging students to actively engage with industry professionals and peers to expand their career opportunities.

The seminar provided valuable insights into real-world applications of robotics and served as a source of motivation for students aspiring to enter the field.

The Robotics Club continues to strive towards fostering innovation, technical expertise, and industry exposure for students. Through participation in competitions, interactive sessions, and hands-on projects, we aim to provide a platform for students to develop their skills and contribute to technological advancements in robotics.

PROJECTS

1. AIDMOS: Disaster Relief System

The club actively participated in the Raspberry Pi Coolest Projects competition, where we presented AIDMOS, an advanced disaster relief system designed to enhance search-and-rescue operations. AIDMOS utilizes drones and infrared sensors to detect and locate individuals trapped in disaster-affected areas. The system integrates the YOLO V5 model, a state-of-the-art object detection algorithm, to accurately identify human presence amidst debris and challenging terrains. The key features of AIDMOS include:

- Autonomous Drones
- Real-time Data Processing
- AI-Driven Detection
- Remote Accessibility

2. Bluetooth-Controlled Car Project | Robu Creato 3.0

As part of the **Robu Creato 3.0** competition, a team of club members developed a **Bluetooth-controlled car** using the **Arduino Uno** microcontroller and the **HC-05 Bluetooth module**. This project was undertaken by **Inay Chauhan, Jegga Chakravarthy, and Lakshmanan AR of XI D**, members of Karyantra Vihar. The vehicle was designed to be operated wirelessly through the **BT Joystick** mobile application, which established a Bluetooth connection with the Arduino. The car's movement was controlled via programmed signals, allowing for real-time maneuverability. The key technical aspects of the project included:

- Microcontroller-Based Control
- Bluetooth Communication
- Embedded C Programming
- Motor Driver Integration
- Mechanical Design

- **Microcontroller-Based Control:** The Arduino Uno processed commands received from the mobile application, enabling navigation.
- **Bluetooth Communication:** The HC-05 module facilitated serial communication between the Arduino and the smartphone for real-time execution of control signals.
- **Embedded C Programming:** The system was programmed in **C**, implementing algorithms for motor control and responsiveness.
- Motor Driver Integration: The L298N motor driver was used to regulate speed and directional movement.

 Mechanical Design: The car featured spring suspension and shock absorption, improving stability and adaptability to different surfaces.

This project provided practical experience in **wireless communication**, **embedded systems**, and **mechanical design**, contributing to the team's understanding of robotics and automation.

3. GARUDA 2.0

An **ornithopter**, **Garuda 2.0**, is currently being developed as a project by **Jegga Chakravarthy** on behalf of the Robotics Club, with assistance from **A.R. Lakshmanan** and juniors from 8th grade, **Vahai**, **Muthu Nilavan and Gurudev**. The initial prototype was constructed using **aluminum**, which resulted in excessive weight. To enhance **aerodynamic efficiency**, the second version was redesigned using **reinforced chopsticks and lightweight cardboard** for a more balanced structure. While the **mechanical framework** of the robotic bird is complete, the **hardware integration** is still in progress. A **2.4 GHz receiver** is yet to be installed to enable remote control functionality. Once finalized, the ornithopter will be fully operational and ready for flight.



Robotics Expo 2024-2025: A Showcase of Innovation and Creativity

The Robotics Expo 2024-2025 was a remarkable event that encouraged students to explore technology, creativity, and teamwork. The event spanned three days, featuring outstanding projects from students across different grade levels. Participants were given the freedom to select their topics and develop innovative projects, with many utilizing Arduino, sensors, and advanced technology to bring their ideas to life.

THE MAKER'S LAB

The Maker's Lab is a facility offered by our school to let students learn, experience and perform creative woodworking and carpentry. The facility comprises 7 machines - Combined Plane, Band Saw, Chisel Mortiser, Belt Disk Sander, Bench Drill, Jigsaw Machine, Wood Lathe machine. We are provided with two types of wood - Indowud (an eco friendly panel product) and Plywood. This is one of the most unique facilities offered by our school as it is lightweight and user- friendly. The maker's Lab is a productive environment which can act as a medium for students to present our creativity in a material mediu

We and Maker's Lab

Maker's Lab provided us an immense help in bringing our project idea into a reality. We - Jegga Chakravarthy and Nabhay of class XI, had enrolled into a mathematics model competition conducted by Sudharshanam Vidyashram on 24 August 2024.

Regarding the competition, our working model idea was Da Vinci's Odometer.

We found the Maker's Lab as an ideal solution to make this model made by the revolutionary scientist. Maker's Lab provision of various facilities served to be an immense boon unparallel to any other. On a day-by-day process, our teacher coordinators - Mr.Koushik sir and Mr. Vidhyasagar sir regularly guided and provided us with valuable insights on the making of the project through wood. We were also assisted by Mr. Vinoth and Mr. Karthi. We were able to work to fullest potential with the equipment available in the lab.

Our Project and its Making:

Our project was Da Vinci's odometer, which measured the distance covered by an object through periodical dropping of metal balls at each revolution of the object's wheel involving the mathematical concept of circumference of circles and their linear application, simple yet an important invention. The idea was provided and researched initially by Jegga Chakravarthy and Voola Nabhay Patro and furthermore the designing of the project to our requirements and respective scaling was done by all four of us with the help of our teachers.

The gears involved were horizontal, vertical disc gears and worm gear. The worm gear was handmade by Jegga Chakravarthy with help of shilpkar/ mould-it clay. The disc gears were made out of cardboard which was strengthened by the correct use of fevi-quick. The front part of the machine is balanced by a plastic roller. The frame designed in such a way that the ball dropped for a specific distance is caught in a box.

This means that the distance travelled by the vehicle is indicated by the number of balls and hence the name odometer.

The machines used were the bench drill, wooden lathe machine, vertical band saw and belt sander including hot glue. We were able to safely use all the machines with the help of our teacher's guidance.

The result of the project was a very clean machine. The difference in the reading taken by moving the odometer and by using the formula was just 0.3 inches and this was due to the fact that there was always a room for human error as everything was hand made by us.



We were able to secured first place at the exhibition after demonstrating our working model.
